Well, you asked for a picture of a beautiful French model!

This curvaceous 1948 Lago Talbot T2C was on show at the Mallala Easter Historic Motor Racing Meeting.

In 1948, the GP Formula 1 cars could be either up to 4500 cc naturally aspirated, or just 1500 cc in supercharged form. This actual car competed around the world and was bought by Reg Hunt in 1980, before being extensively rebuilt. Power output was 275 B.H.P, giving a top speed of 175 m.p.h.

Entrant Ron Townley brought the car from Victoria to compete in the meeting.

A wide range of other cars took part in the weekend's racing and regularity trials. Entry provided an opportunity to wander around the pits and for those with classic cars, a specific grassed area on which to park.

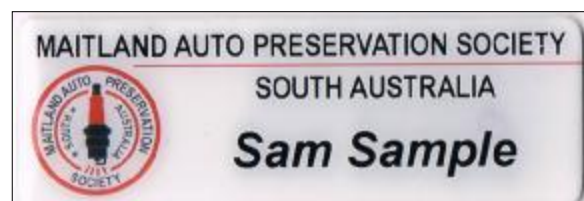

We headed off from Ardrossan with the Bristol and the Avon in tow, staying with our fellow travelers, Trevor and Lorraine Beythien of the CRCA for one night in Adelaide, before heading for the starting point at Dandenong. They have a very nice 1936 Chrysler C7 sedan and a period caravan. Apart from some high running temperatures on a hot day as we headed up through the Heysen Tunnel, our trip to a pleasant overnight stop at Beaufort was uneventful. The next morning saw us take on the heavy traffic of the Melbourne freeways, Westgate Bridge and Domain Tunnel. We opted for a very pleasant park at Carrum Downs, backing on to a pleasant parkland area.



Saturday morning saw the mass of cars being flagged off from the RACV's premises, but not before a splendid cooked breakfast. This was to be just a taster for the food we would enjoy over the next week. A display of the RACV historic vehicles and a pipe band all added to the atmosphere. Just 5 caravans in the whole group, with everyone making good time- no slow convoys during the week. On towards our first night at Cowes in Philip Island, which incidentally is not an ideal place to take dogs, due to various restrictions.
